<u>1 Thessalonians 4: 16-17</u> and 5: 9-10

We are embarking on a concentrated study of "Eschatology" (the study of last things)

A key point to remember for serious study of the Bible: Do not blindly accept anything any teacher has to say

Be a Berean: <u>Acts 17:11</u>

Acts 20: 27 - our reliance is on the *"whole counsel of God",* in context!!

Presuppositions:

The only barrier to truth is the presumption that you already have it!

THE BIBLE IS THE FOUNDATION FOR OUR STUDY

God chose a book to convey must know information to those on planet earth -

Bible prophecy authenticates His message to His creation

 The Old Testament contains over 330 prophecies concerning His first coming

2) There are over 2,100 prophecies concerning His second coming

Christ's second coming deals with Christ establishing <u>His Kingdom</u> The Bible shapes one's <u>worldview</u> accurately and reveals where history is heading

The accuracy of Biblical transmission:

 No work in antiquity compares with the accuracy of the transmission of Scripture
The Bible has proven to be 98.5% textually pure

Worldview:

- The lens one looks through to determine what is true and what is not true

- How an individual will view their world

A <u>worldview</u> attempts to answer four questions:

Who am I?
How did I get here?
Why am I here?
Where am I going?

I believe that Christianity answers these questions better than any other worldview! There are many worldviews: Secular, Eastern, New Age, Wiccan, Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist, Atheist, Christian, etc.

The question that each person must answer is which worldview is correct?



THE RAPTURE OF THE CHURCH <u>1 Thessalonians 4: 16-17</u>


The Greek term is *"harpazo"* = to be forcibly caught up <u>1 Thessalonians 4:17</u>

There are different views of the timing of the rapture

A question to ask yourself: Are we looking for Christ to return, or are we looking for the antichrist?



"Pre-Wrath" Rapture



Is the blessed hope the Rapture or the Second Coming?

Rapture Distinct from Second Advent

Rapture	Second Coming	
(1 Thess 4:13-17; 1 Cor 15:51-57)	(Rev 19:11-16)	
Christ comes in the air (1 Thess 4:16)	Christ comes to the earth (Zech 14:4)	
For His saints (1 Thess 4:15-17)	With His saints (Rev 19:14)	
Blessing (1 Thess 4:18)	Judgment (Rev 19:15)	
Effects only believers (1 Thess 4:16)	Effects both believers and unbelievers (Rev 19:15)	
Invisible (1 Thess 4:16)	Visible to all (Rev 1:7)	
Announced only by an archangel (1 Thess 4:16)	Involves myriads of angels (Jude 14)	
Resurrection (1 Cor15: 51)	No resurrection

Scriptures that talk about the Rapture:

- 1) The *promise* -John 14: 1-3
- 2) The *process* -<u>1 Thessalonians 4: 13-18</u>
- 3) The *purpose -*<u>1 Corinthians 15: 50-55</u>
- 4) The *prophetic profile* <u>2Thessalonians 2: 3</u>

The <u>Book of Revelation</u> takes prophecies scattered throughout the <u>Old Testament</u> and puts them into an order that the sequence of events can be determined.

Revelation was written by John (in 96 A.D.) on the island of Patmos because of his Christian stand -<u>Revelation 1: 9</u>



Schools of Interpretation:

- 1) <u>Symbolic view</u> interprets Revelation as a picture of spiritual truth
- 2) <u>Preterist View</u> sees all of Revelation fulfilled in the 1st century
- 3) <u>Historic View</u> sees Revelation as a panoramic view of Church history
- 4) Futurist view sees Revelation Chapters 6-22 as yet future - Literal Interpretation View

Premillennialism - Christ will come to earth *before the Millennium* to rule the world

Postmillennialism - The Second Coming of Christ is *after the Millennium*

Amillennialism - no Millennium; there is no literal reign of Christ on earth

CONCLUSION:

The marching orders for the Church are clear - True Christianity is active, not passive!

1) "As the Father has sent Me, I also send you" - John 20: 21-22

2) "Be My witnesses, even to the remotest part of the earth" - <u>Acts 1:8</u>

3) "Go into the world and preach the gospel to all creation" - <u>Mark 16: 15-16</u>

4) "That repentance for forgiveness of sins would be proclaimed in His name to all the nations" - Luke 24:7

5) "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you" - <u>Matthew 28: 19-20</u> The Book of Revelation will tell us what to expect as our world winds down, how things end.

There is a new world coming; God wants everyone to be part of His new world. *The invitation goes out to all!*

Think of this:

We are still here; we still have the honor and the privilege of serving our Lord.

These Scriptures are clear, this is what God expects from us.

Don't waste your life - engage in things that will last for eternity.

You will be absolutely ecstatic that you did!!
