### How do we know the Bible is inspired by God?

- 1) Internal consistency
- 2) Fulfilled prophecy

## Matthew, Mark and Luke are synoptic Gospels

**Synoptic** = with the same eye; seeing together

Each of the four Gospels has a different audience in mind

# The Structure of Matthew: 5 Discourses of Jesus

- 1. Sermon of the Mount (5-7)
- The Sending of the 12 disciples (10:1-11:1)
- Parables of the Kingdom (13)
- Greatest in the Kingdom: Instruction for the Church (18)
- 5. Olivet Discourse Warning of final judgment (23-25)
- \*Each section ends with "When Jesus finished these words."

Matthew was written to the Jews, with an offer of the Kingdom – Matthew Chapters 1-12

This offer was rejected by the Jewish leadership - Matthew 12: 20

The offer was rescinded when the nation's leadership blasphemed the Holy Spirit - Matthew 12: 31

The Church Age followed and will continue "until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in"

**Romans 11: 25** 

The "fullness of the Gentiles" is a set number saved during the Church Age

Acts 15: 14

#### THE INTERTESTAMENTAL PERIOD

400 years of silence

From Malachi to Matthew, there was no prophet in Israel, *no Word from God!* 

Had God forgotten His people?

NO WAY!!

God was working through the nations to prepare for Messiah to come

God used <u>Babylon</u> for His purpose - to display His wrath on idolatrous Israel

God used <u>Persia</u> for His purpose – to restore His people to their land and Jerusalem

God used Greece for His purpose - to establish a universal language

God used Rome for His purpose – to establish a road system to spread the Gospel

## Paul tells us exactly what God was doing - <u>Galatians 4: 4</u>

God is acting today for His purpose!

GOD IS NOT SILENT!

Rapid world changes scream *God is* at work today!!

#### WHAT WE MUST REMEMBER:

There will be a perfect time, in the future, when God will take action - HIS SON WILL RETURN!!

### **Verse 1 - 2**

# Matthew connects the Old and New Testament with a genealogy



MATTHEW is like a "bridge" ... linking the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures.

"The genealogy of Jesus Christ" - the most important person to ever live!

Jesus is the Savior for all mankind - the hope of all mankind!

Joseph was told of Jesus' mission by an angel - Matthew 1: 21

"... for He will save His people from their sins"

### **Verse 3 - 6**

# Surprise!! There are women in Jesus' genealogy

It is unusual for women to be included in a Jewish genealogy

This section mentions four: Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba

Women are very much inferior to men in the east (this continues today)

Christianity has set women free and improved their status in life!

Islam, Hinduism, and Communism all treat women as property with little rights

### **Verse 7 - 10**

# There are good and bad kings in the genealogy

# This demonstrates that Godliness and righteousness are not inherited

There are good kings with bad sons and bad kings with good sons

Every person is responsible before God for their life and behavior!

Parents, who are followers of Messiah, have a mission – <u>Proverbs 22: 6</u> *This is a principle, not a promise!* 

Each person must decide to believe and receive the gift of salvation

John 1: 12-13

Real sheep follow the <u>Good Shepherd</u>

John 10: 27

False sheep follow <u>whomever</u> – a big difference, <u>an eternal difference!</u>

# Verse 11 - 17 God preserves His people

Never forget: God is with His people through terrible times, awful times and the "why?" times!

God is orchestrating all of history, raising up kings and bringing down kings

**Don't panic:** This applies to presidents also; there are no mistakes with God!

America has gotten what America desires - *post Christian leadership!* 

### In the midst of change and chaos – GOD IS WITH YOU!!

God will not forsake you! <u>Hebrews 13: 5</u>

God will go through the fire with you – <u>Isaiah 43: 1-3</u>

God is in the furnace with you!
(3 Hebrew slaves)

#### **CLOSING THOUGHTS:**

The Jewish people have been persecuted and dispersed throughout the world since Babylonian captivity

Persecution of Jews and Christians is crescendoing today

The persecuted and the disappointed have reason to live with anger and unforgiveness

Think about Hitler and Nazi death camps

### NAZI DEATH CAMPS

VAIVARA

The Nazi regime established its first concentration camp, Dachau, almost immediately after coming to power in Germany in 1933. By the time World War II ended 12 years later, they had built 20 main concentration camps and four others devoted solely to exterminating prisoners. Belzec, Chelmno, Sobibor and Treblinka. Auschwitz combined elements of concentration camps and extermination camps.



### How can humans recover from this type of atrocity?

Lessons from Auschwitz: 40% recovered and 60% did not

#### What made the difference?

Those who did not recover continued to relive the experiences and perpetuated despondency

Those who did recover determined to move on from the pain of the past, chose not to relive their experiences

### In the genealogy of Christ, there are many abused and persecuted people

Jesus Messiah is the abused, persecuted, disappointed <u>HEALER!</u>

Jesus is the only One who can restore normalcy in an abnormal world!

The Apostle Paul lived through many atrocities and disappointments

His advice for not living in the past:

Philippians 3: 13-14

#### Let's be honest here - HURT HAPPENS!




Our study in <u>Matthew</u> will show us how much Jesus really does care for us!
