




Spirit Comes In Us

(The New Birth)


Single-Mindedness

<u>Verse 1 - 2</u>

Jesus' character is tested by Satan - the wilderness

What is character?

- Strength of moral fiber
- The excellence of moral being (Tozer)
- Character is influenced and developed by our choices = Faith choice or Flesh choice

The tempter chooses his spots; he comes at an opportune time

You will pass your character test if:

- 1) If you are yielded to the Holy Spirit's control
- 2) If you remain in Christ
- 3) If you stay connected to your power source
- 4) If you do not rely on your own strength
- 5) If you make faith choices, not flesh choices

You can, through the Spirit, overcome the tempter!

The wilderness, what is it? It is a time of God-ordained testing

What do we learn in the wilderness?

The wilderness is a place that we learn to rely on God alone for our needs

The wilderness is a place where the GOD OF HOPE breaks through the fog of life

The First Temptation - the flesh

Satan is a tempter and a slanderer; he accuses and divides; he is a liar and a murderer – John 8: 44

THE TEST:

Satan is tempting Jesus to act independent of God

Jesus' mission and purpose is total submission to the will of God John 6: 38

All temptations come from the world, the flesh and the devil

How did Jesus deal with temptations of the flesh?

"It is written"

In dealing with the devil, you *must* know and use the Word of God!

The Word of God is your sword! Ephesians 6:17


<u>Verse 5 - 7</u>

The Second Temptation - the world

This is world-pride test

Christ is tempted to attract attention by doing the spectacular = pride

To presume upon God to rescue Him from something God did not tell Him to do





My will VS God's will

Verse 8 - 11

The Third Temptation - the devil

The devil is sly; he is presenting Jesus with a <u>COMPROMISE!</u>

You can have all the kingdoms of this world, Jesus, just worship me (Satan) –

COMPROMISE!

Avoid the cross, take the easy way, no suffering, no sacrifice – <u>COMPROMISE!</u>

COMPROMISE is the devil's tool; compromise your integrity, character, take the easy way!

Jesus sets Satan straight:

"Away with you Satan!"

Scripture tells us how to handle Satan's temptations:

- 1) Make a faith choice instead of a flesh choice Galatians 5: 16
- 2) Say <u>NO</u> to his schemes Ephesians 6: 11
- 3) We are instructed to <u>flee</u> the flesh <u>2 Timothy 2: 22</u>
- 4) We are instructed by <u>James</u> to resist <u>James 4: 7</u>


CLOSING THOUGHTS:

Two errors people make with the devil (C.S. Lewis)


- 1) Too much emphasis on the devil the devil of everything! The devil cannot make you do anything

STOP

We are commanded to stop (literally)...rest, relax, let go, and make time for God. The scene is one of stillness and quietness, listening and waiting before Him. Such foreign experiences in these busy times! Nevertheless, knowing God deeply and intimately requires such discipline. Silence is indispensable if we hope to add depth to our spiritual life.

Psalm 46:10 Be still and know that I am God.

SOLITUDE

Solitude is an oasis of the soul where we see ourselves, others, and especially our God in new ways. In solitude, struggles occur that no one else knows about. Inner battles are fought here that seldom become fodder for sermons or illustrations for books. God, who probes our deepest thoughts during protracted segments of solitude, opens our eyes to things that need attention. It is here He makes us aware of those things we try to hide from others.

Psalm 94:19 When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, your consolations delight my soul.

SURRENDER

Anyone whose determined purpose is to become more deeply and intimately acquainted with God cannot retain the rights to his own position or place...or be anxiously preoccupied with working out the details of his own life. There must be complete and unqualified reliance on the Living Lord. In other words, one must develop the discipline of surrender.

Psalm 62:5 My soul, wait in silence for God only, for my hope is from Him.

SOVEREIGNTY

God is fully trustworthy. I am finally learning this. I'm finally learning that His sovereign plan is the best plan. That whatever I entrust to Him, He can take care of better than I. That nothing under His control can ever be out of control. That everything I need, He knows about in every detail. That He is able to supply, to guide, to start, to stop, to sustain, to change and to correct in His time and for His purposes. When I keep my hands out of things, His will is accomplished, His Name is exalted, and His glory magnified.
