
The Setting: It is morning and Jesus is hungry


Jesus encounters a fig tree that is not productive, not fulfilling its purpose


Jesus is hungry

Jesus is a man, as well as God

At the incarnation, the eternal Second Person of the God Head (*Trinity*), took on humanity







Jesus is now forever the God/Man


Jesus did this voluntarily, and He did it for you, His Bride, the Church!

There is an expectation of the Bride of Christ, what is it?

- To be fruitful
- To be watchful and waiting
- To be loyal and faithful to your Bride Groom!

Verse 19 - 20 Cursing of the fruitless

The fig tree represents Israel in Scripture. It is expected to be fruitful and PRODUCTIVE!



The fig tree was not fulfilling its purpose


It looked good, but had no fruit and was useless

What did Jesus do to the fruitless fig tree?

He cursed it!

Does this mean God is done with Israel?

NO!!




National Israel has been set aside for a time

THE TIME OF THE GENTILES will continue until Messiah returns at His Second Coming

What is the time of the Gentiles?

"And Jerusalem will be trampled by Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled" - Luke 21: 24b

The Time of the Gentiles = Babylonian captivity until the Second Coming of Christ



The setting aside is temporary, God is not through with Israel!

The fulness of the Gentiles

I do not desire, brethren, that you should be ignorant of this mystery, lest you should be wise in your own opinion, that blindness in part has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in. ²⁶ And so all Israel will be saved, as it is written:

"The Deliverer will come out of Zion, And He will turn away ungodliness from Jacob; ²⁷ For this is My covenant with them, When I take away their sins."



A set number of people saved during the Church age, prior to the Second Coming of Christ



Verse 21 - 22

Be fruitful, have faith, and do not doubt

What is faith?

"Being sure of what you hope for and certain of what you cannot see." - Hebrews 11:1

It is important to believe and trust God in prayer!

Does this guarantee we get what we want?

NO!

We are too depraved to have "what we want power"

Real faith involves surrendering to God's will

Matthew 26: 39 Matthew 6: 10

1 John 5: 15 1 John 3: 21

God loves it when we <u>ask</u> in faith

God does not like it when we <u>ask</u> and doubt <u>James 1: 2-8</u>

CLOSING:

The cursing of the fig tree has everything to do with fruitfulness - fulfilling your purpose!

What is this cursing all about?

The generation that rejected Jesus is cursed, they will not enter the millennial kingdom

The kingdom is postponed; God has not replaced Israel with the Church!

The Church will take up the mantle of telling the world about Jesus

God will revisit Israel, as His people, in the Tribulation period

What is fruit?

Fruit is not something that you produce

Fruit is a natural result of abiding in Christ, making your home in Christ - John 15: 5

Fruit looks a whole lot like Christian character - Galatians 5: 22-23

Are your roots dried up? Are you feeling lifeless?


Allow God to lift you out of the miry clay of disappointment and set you once again on the Rock!
