Disciples of Christ: Beware of Dead Religion Matthew 23: 1-12

Verse 1 - 3

<u>Disciples of Christ</u>: Dead religion seizes authority

In Jesus' last sermon, Jesus warns about the religious system:

- He warns about the Pharisees:

What Moses says, do!
Obey what Moses taught

What the Pharisees add, don't do!



Past Tense:

Separation from the Penalty of Sin

You have been saved

Justification

1 Corinthians 6:11; Titus 3:5 Colossians 1:13, 14; Eph. 2:8, 9 Romans 5:1, 2; Colossians 2:13, 14

Present Tense:

Separation from the Power of Sin

You are being saved.

Sanctification

Philippians 1:6; 2:12,13; 2 Cor. 5:17 2 Peter 3:17, 18; Romans 8:29 2 Corinthians 3:18; 4:16, 17

Future Tense:

Separation from the *Presence* of Sin

You will be saved.

Glorification

Matthew 10:22; James 1:12 Hebrews 10:39; Revelation 2:10 Philippians 3:20, 21; 1 John 3:2

Disciples of Christ:

A better you is emerging

Looking more like Jesus and less like the old you

Verse 4

<u>Disciples of Christ</u>: Dead religion places heavy loads

Dead religion goes beyond what God commands, it adds one's own preferences

All the adding is designed to make one righteous before God - <u>WRONG!!</u>

What makes a person spiritual?

- Submitting to the Holy Spirit
- Walking in the Spirit
- Dwelling in Christ
- I want to please God more than I want to please myself and my flesh

Verse 5 - 7

<u>Disciples of Christ</u>: Dead religion loves the praise of men

Pharisees want the attention - "all eyes on me" syndrome

They dressed in religious garb to impress the people - all for show!




Jesus, *only*, is to be extolled in the body of Christ

All in the body of Messiah are important! All have a role; all have a purpose

When you feel undervalued, taken advantage of, think of Jesus!

Think of Elijah!



GOD:

"I have reserved seven thousand in Israel, all whose knees have not bowed to Baal." (1 Kings 19: 18)

God does not revere a pouting, poor me spirit



Verse 8 - 10

Disciples of Christ: All eyes on Jesus

Jesus tells His disciples not to strive for a title that gives you recognition and prestige

What is Jesus doing here?

He is condemning pride that seeks after titles

Verse 11 - 12

Disciples of Christ: The first shall be last

Greatness in the eyes of God is not about titles, but obedience and service

Greatness in this world has always been about a push to the top

 Stampede over others, pull them down, so I can promote myself






Christians must resist this urge! It is not about self-promotion, but God promotion!

Psalm 75:6-7

6 For exaltation comes neither from the east Nor from the west or from the south.
7 But God is the Judge: He puts down one, And exalts another.



A time for balance: There is healthy ambition; work hard, get ahead, to enjoy the product of your labor

Moreover, when God gives someone wealth and possessions, and the ability to enjoy them, to accept their lot and be happy in their toil—this is a gift of God. They seldom reflect on the days of their life, because God keeps them occupied with gladness of heart. Ecclesiastes 5:19-20 NIV

We are instructed in Scripture to have ambition and to work hard - Colossians 3: 23-24

Allow Jesus to exalt you!

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time.

1 PETER 5:6 KJV

Work hard, with excellence

Have a great attitude!

and

Allow God to promote you!
